Percentage of Time Required	Effective on the date indicated, the employee assigned to the position identified above performs the following duties and responsibilities.		
30%	Under the general direction of the Deputy State Fire Marshal III Supervisor, the incumbent performs specialized inspection work under specific contracts; performs as branch office lead deputy in the assigned geographical area; enforces all laws and regulations of the State Fire Marshal, including fire prevention engineering, education, enforcement and planning. This position performs the more technical inspections and problem solving, including in-depth analysis and fire prevention engineering solutions. Inspection and law enforcement functions including fireworks and fire extinguisher programs, court appearances, and performance in emergency activities through the Governor's Office of Emergency Services. Duties include but are not limited to: *Enforce regulations in all state owned/occupied structures according to established inspection priority schedule; meet with occupants to assist in compliance; and assist in the development of alternate means of protection requests to the Division Chief in accordance with established policy.		
20%	*Review plans and specifications for compliance with adopted regulations and standards; meet with architects, engineers and project managers, conduct field inspections of construction sites; witness acceptance tests of fire alarms, sprinkler systems, Halon, and other suppression systems; conduct final walk through inspections and fire clearance. Prepare letters of instruction and recommendation to building owners; maintain records of inspections, enforcement and compliance with State Fire Marshal laws and regulations; prepare workload and inspection activity reports for supervisor; attend meetings of fire prevention groups to give fire prevention talks; conduct informal hearings and prepare cases for court, as required.		
15%	*Enforce State Fire Marshal regulations for all specialized contracts such as Department of Transportation, Board of Corrections, Department of Corrections, State Universities, the UC Regents, Department of Health Services; perform function of local fire marshal for contract cities and counties. *These are the essential functions for this position. Essential functions are those functions that the individual who holds the position must be able to perform unaided or with the assistance of a reasonable accommodation.

*Administer State Fire Marshal adopted regulations and Health & Safety Code Section 13145, 13146.1, 13146.2 for all detention facilities, schools, R-1 occupancies within State Fire Marshal jurisdiction and assist local authorities having jurisdiction.

10%

*Conduct specialized fire and life safety inspections of complex facilities, such as Hazardous Occupancies, Public Assemblies, Colleges and Universities and obtains compliance through fire protection engineering, education, and enforcement; conduct enforcement activities in the area of Fire Extinguisher Regulations, Fireworks Regulations, and fire cause investigations. May be required to administer and proctor Portable Fire Extinguisher Exams in the absence of a DSFM III Supervisor

*Provide specialized fire protection consulting, plan review and field inspections to other state agencies such as Division of the State Architect, CalTrans, Trustees of California State University, State Fairs, and other political entities as requested by contract, plan review and field inspections.

5%

*Perform fire origin and cause investigations; administers fire extinguisher and pyrotechnic exams in branch offices; conduct/administer course of instruction in accordance with Health & Safety Code 13105.5 and other related subjects. Represent and speak on behalf of the California State Fire Marshal at meetings for fire service organizations and associations, local government, industry groups, public organizations, etc. *Perform other job related duties as assigned.

Desirable Qualifications:

- Knowledge of Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, PowerPoint)

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Job qualifications and/or conditions of employment: The incumbent may be required to wear respiratory protection equipment, including a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The use of such equipment may place a physiological burden on the incumbent that varies with the type of equipment used, the job and workplace conditions in which the equipment is used, and the medical status of the incumbent. As such, California Occupational Safety and Health Administration (CalOSHA) requires that the incumbent be annually medically cleared to be fit-tested for respiratory protection equipment. This clearance process consists of a comprehensive medical evaluation including a review of the incumbent's medical history, a complete physical examination, and vision, hearing, spirometry, and exercise treadmill tests. Duties involve field work requiring physical performance calling for above-average ability, endurance, and superior condition, including occasional demand for extraordinarily strenuous activities in emergencies, under adverse environmental conditions, and over extended periods of time; requires running, walking, difficult climbing, jumping, twisting, bending and lifting over 25 pounds; and the pace of work is typically set by the emergency.
