Under the supervision of the Supervising Registered Nurse II/III, Correctional Facility (CF), and the delegation and clinical direction of the Registered Nurse (RN), CF and other members of the licensed nursing team, the Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), CF performs various patient care activities and related nonprofessional health care activities for patients in a variety of treatment facilities and health care settings. As directed and in collaboration with the nursing care team, the CNA, CF is primarily responsible for performing basic nursing care procedures, assisting patients with physical, personal care, activities of daily living, and ambulatory assistance needs. The CNA, CF is responsible for addressing the ongoing needs of patients, working with the licensed nursing staff and other health care providers, and promoting the efficient, appropriate, and cost-effective use of health care resources.

<b>ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS</b>						
40%	Provides general physical and personal patient care including oral hygiene, bathing, showering, toileting, assistance with ambulation, and positioning and turning patients as needed. Observes and records changes to the patient's condition, and reports the findings to the care team, RN, and supervisor. Obtains and documents clinical data such as vital signs, height, weight, and observations of patient behavior and health status and reports results to the appropriate nursing staff. Measures and records the amount of intake and output of fluids and assists with meeting hydration needs. Obtains specimens for diagnostic testing in compliance with Department policies and procedures. Keeps patients dry and clean and provides clean clothing and linen as appropriate. In collaboration with the health care team, assist patients in activities such as bed sitting, muscle toning, and improving range of motion to increase the ability to perform daily living activities. Assists and encourages patients in using the special devices and equipment prescribed for physical comfort and/or rehabilitation. Administers basic life support in emergency situations.

<p><b>5%</b></p>	<p>Attends all trainings, meetings, and committees as directed by the Chief Nurse Executive or designee. Participates in quality improvement activities such as audits and participation on the Quality Improvement Team.</p>
<p><b>5%</b></p>	<p>Maintains a safe and secure work environment and follows all safety precautions and Department policies and procedures. Reports any unsafe equipment or inappropriate conduct and/or activity to management.</p>
<p><b>5%</b></p>	<p>Performs other duties as required.</p>
