MISSION OF SECTION:

The mission of the Off-Road Implementation Section (ORIS) is to achieve emission reductions from the off-road sector through implementation of the In-Use Off-Road Diesel-Fueled Fleets Regulation (Off-Road Regulation). The Section accomplishes this through direct fleet assistance, regulatory expertise, outreach, training, and development of reporting and compliance assistance tools. The Section is responsible for coordinating within CARB and other stakeholders to achieve high compliance rates. The section develops and maintains the Diesel Off-Road Online Reporting System (DOORS), the reporting tool for the Off-Road Regulation and implements the DOORS hotline, which is a dedicated compliance assistance effort specific for these regulations. Additionally, the Section is responsible for supporting rule development and other policy considerations to achieve additional emission reductions from the off-road sector to carry out the mission of CARB. The Section also supports development of other regulations, plans, and technical assessments, as needed.

CONCEPT OF POSITION:

Under general supervision of the Air Resources Supervisor I, the incumbent performs Air Pollution Specialist work as follows: coordinates implementation of the amendments to the In-Use Off-Road Diesel-Fueled Fleets Regulation (Off-Road Amendments). This involves conducting training on the amendments, processing reporting information and preparing referrals for enforcement. The incumbent will also lead outreach efforts and development of recognition programs. Some travel may be required
