CIIS provides support for California Climate Investments community-centered programs focused on housing, land use, and building decarbonization and leads the Division's efforts to advance sustainable, equitable growth.

Specifically, CIIS develops strategies and quantification tools to measure and communicate environmental, economic, and public health benefits that arise from investments; leads outreach and engagement efforts with public partners and facilitates coordination with interagency partners; supports the integration of workforce development standards into select programs; develops and supports policies to advance housing production and preservation and other growth in a way that aligns with climate and equity objectives; and supports California Air Resources Board (CARB) efforts to advance racial equity at all levels.

<u>CONCEPT OF POSITION</u>: The manager will work closely with the Branch Chief, the Division Office, and other managers within the Branch and Division to meet the mission of the section and the goals of the Branch and Division through collaborative leadership, expertise, and initiative. The manager is responsible for staffing and contract resources, supervising the section's work to ensure deliverables are meeting objectives and timelines, reinforcing personnel and other administrative policies and procedures, and resolving sensitive program and personal issues with tact and diplomacy.
