PRIMARY DOMAIN:						
Under the supervision of the Chief Physician and Surgeon, Correctional Facility (CF) the Nurse Practitioner (NP), CF assesses and manages the health care needs of patients in ambulatory, inpatient, and specialized clinical settings. The NP, CF performs physical examinations and therapeutic procedures; interprets routine laboratory and imaging results; and educates and counsels patients regarding matters pertaining to their physical and mental health. The NP, CF may also be assigned call duties with back up supervision by a physician manager.

55%	Evaluates and treats an assigned panel of patients including co-managing more complex and higher risk patients in consultation with a designated physician. Obtains and reviews relevant medical histories. Performs physical examinations and minor procedures within the approved guidelines, protocols, and NP scope of practice standards and conducts preventative screening procedures based on age of the patient and other clinical factors. Formulates the appropriate differential diagnoses based upon the history, physical examination, and diagnostic results. Develops and implements appropriate treatment plans. Orders appropriate diagnostic tests (e.g., laboratory, x-ray, electrocardiogram) and accurately interprets test results. Identifies and orders appropriate

Conducts patient rounds in the inpatient setting. Performs disability evaluations and determines suitability for duty assignments. Performs minor procedures, delivers urgent and emergency care, and performs specialty examinations or consults as assigned including patients referred to higher levels of care for psychiatric and behavioral reasons. Completes appeal responses and other documentation in accordance with Department policy. Makes appropriate referrals to other health professionals and community agencies upon a patient's release from CDCR. Responds to medical emergencies within the prison.</p> <p>Documents detailed assessments and treatments provided for each patient. Requests, reviews, and maintains medical records in accordance with Department policies and procedures. Monitors patients to determine the effectiveness of the plan of care. Reassesses and modifies the plan of care as necessary to achieve medical and health goals. Consults with a supervisory or collaborating physician on medical treatments. Promotes patient participation in the plan of care, and counsels and educates patients on health behaviors, preventive and self-care skills, and treatment options.</p> <p>Participates in multidisciplinary care conferences and professional practice and process improvement meetings including but not limited to Daily Huddles, Population Management Working Sessions, Quality Management Subcommittees, and Peer Review forums. Assists in updating standardized procedures as necessary. Effectively uses the Electronic Health Record System, patient registries, and other care tools. Attends training and continuing education sessions as directed by management.</p> <p>Performs other duties as required.</p>
	<p>KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES</p> <p><i>Knowledge of:</i> Current trends and concepts of professional nursing practices; laws and regulations relating to the NP scope of practice; principles and practices of clinical assessment of common health problems; principles of mental health; causes, treatment, and prevention of communicable diseases, chronic diseases, mental illness, and other disabling conditions; and continuity of patient care, and the community health care resources.</p> <p><i>Ability to:</i> Work effectively with patients to assist them in solving physical, mental, and social health problems; communicate effectively; prepare clear and concise reports; recognize social problems which affect health; instruct in the prevention of disease, good health practices, and the health care of an ill or injured person; participate in the development of standardized procedures; construct and interpret a medical history; perform physical assessments, evaluate patient behavior, perform and interpret laboratory tests, and identify problems and develop and implement treatment plans for patients; and maintain effective working relationships with health care professionals and others.</p> <p>LICENSE REQUIREMENT</p> <p>Possession of a current license as a Registered Nurse in California and possession of a current certification as an NP by the Board of Registered Nurses.</p> <p>DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS</p> <p>Perform appropriate procedures within the NP, CF scope of practice and be willing to mentor and assist in training other medical staff.</p> <p>SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS OR CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CCHCS does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes.
