### **GENERAL STATEMENT**

The Staff Services Manager I will receive direct supervision from the Associate Deputy Director for Industry Engagement and Development and general program direction from the Senior Deputy Director at Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz). The SSMI will support initiatives led by the regional Trade and Investment Representatives and facilitate collaboration across REDI, International, and CalBIS teams, especially related to external events, trade shows, conferences, and other convenings at which there is an international business audience. The SSMI will directly manage the Foreign Investment Analyst (AGPA).

"International business development" as referenced here includes any efforts by the unit to directly or indirectly increase foreign investment in California, with the effect of stimulating economic activity in California. This position regularly supports activities with foreign individuals, organizations, and events. Travel may be required up to 15%. The SSMI responsibilities will include the following:

This involves preparation of reports, briefings and other planning and reporting materials as appropriate.</li> <li>Act as ombudsperson to drive solutions and response on international investment problems, inquiries, complaints, or requests for special technical assistance arising between foreign investors, government, and private stakeholders, including serving as a subject matter resource on international investment for the CalBIS team.</li> <li>Monitor and track U.S. Treasury's Committee for Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS) or any other formal foreign investment review process affecting California investment that may arise.</li> <li>Develop foreign investment information for relevant briefing books and meeting background materials.</li> <li>Help identify and support delivery of foreign investment that expands growth of California ports, airports, and other projects to expand California gateway activity.</li> <li>Complete analytical work and research related to the development of the foreign direct investment program and strategy and provide research that helps guide the direction of the state's international affairs engagement. This may include but is not limited to:</li> <li>Researching and analyzing international investment and trade data, reviewing and analyzing economic data and relevant geopolitical trends in key markets, preparing reports and briefing documents, and advising man</li></ul>
