Persons who meet the minimum qualifications as stated on this announcement may take this competitive examination.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Either One:

Education: Equivalent to two years of college including completion of college-level introductory laboratory courses in general chemistry, general biology, and microbiology.

Or Two:

Experience: One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of a Senior Laboratory Assistant or Animal Technician III. **and**

Education: Equivalent to completion of the twelfth grade, and completion of college-level introductory laboratory courses in chemistry and a biological science.

Or Three:

Experience: Two years in the California state service performing the duties of a Laboratory Assistant, Range B, or Animal Technician II. **and**

Education: Equivalent to completion of the twelfth grade, and completion of college-level introductory laboratory courses in chemistry and a biological science.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS

All candidates for, appointees to, and employees in the state civil service shall possess the general qualifications of integrity, honesty, sobriety, dependability, industry, thoroughness, accuracy, good judgment, initiative, resourcefulness, courtesy, ability to work cooperatively with others, willingness and ability to assume the responsibilities and to conform to the conditions of work characteristic of the employment, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

TYPICAL TASKS

Processes specimens for examination by microbiologists; concentrates specimens; prepares mounts and stained slides; assists in autopsying animals; bleeds animals; prepares tissue for tissue culture; prepares cultural and biochemical setups for microbiologists; prepares complicated reagents and media for specific tests; performs quality control procedures on media and reagents; assists microbiologists in preparation of antigens and antisera; tests special media to evaluate its usage by professional staff; assists microbiologist in application of quality control standards; processes and labels reagents and solutions; discards test setups after testing is completed; checks normal tissue cultures and distributes; prepares stains and fixatives for electron microscopes; processes tissue sections for electron microscopy; performs special handling and sealing of ampules for storage in liquid nitrogen; and assists in training of subordinate laboratory personnel.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION

The examination will consist of a Qualifications Assessment and is the sole component of the Public Health Laboratory Technician I Microbiology examination. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received. The Qualifications Assessment is designed to elicit specific information regarding each candidate's education, training, and experience relative to the testing classification. Responses to the questionnaire will be assessed based on pre-determined rating criteria. The Qualifications Assessment package will be emailed to the applicant in the form of a survey. Please monitor your email account's SPAM, Junk, Bulk, etc. Folder (s) as the examination email may be filtered depending on your specific account settings.

The participating department's reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meets the needs of the service in the circumstances under which this examination has changed. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION

It is your responsibility to make sure you meet the education and/or experience requirements stated on this announcement by the final filing date, **July 11, 2022.** Your signature on your application indicates that you have <u>read</u>, <u>understood</u>, and <u>possess</u> the basic qualifications required.

NOTE: Applications **must** include "to" and "from" dates (month/day/year), time base, job titles and/or civil service class title(s), and range (if applicable) for all work experience. College course Information **must** include title, number of semester or quarter units, name of institution, completion dates, and degree. Applications received without this information will be rejected. Applicants <u>must</u> submit a copy of either official or unofficial transcripts along with the application when using education to meet the entrance requirements for this examination.

SCOPE OF EXAMINATION: Rankings will be determined based on the depth and breadth of professional education and experience beyond what is minimally required. Emphasis will be placed on measuring:

Knowledge of:

- 1. Laboratory bench methods and equipment and laboratory instrumentation.
- 2. Principles of qualitative and quantitative analyses to aid in diagnostic work.
- 3. Principles of quality control when handling sensitive data in the laboratory.
- 4. Various computer programs such as Microsoft Word, Excel, and Outlook.
- 5. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requirements, Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Guidelines, as well as any other regulations/requirements as they pertain to the laboratory safety.
- 6. The use of chemicals and their interactions, danger signs, production techniques, and disposal methods.
- 7. Fundamentals of biology, chemistry, and elementary mathematics.

Skills to:

- 1. Maintain a neat and orderly workspace to maintain health and safety standards.
- 2. Prepare laboratory reagents and solutions for analysis.
- 3. Perform high quality hand-eye coordination to accomplish the tasks of the job.
- 4. Identify and communicate results that require further investigation or discussion with Department Manager/Supervisor.
- 5. Use scientific rules and methods to solve problems.
- 6. Use logic and reasoning to identify the strengths and weaknesses of alternative solutions, conclusions, or approaches to problems.
- 7. Analyze information and use logic to address work-related issues and problems.
- 8. Perform complete, detailed, and thorough work tasks.
- 9. Solve problems and troubleshoot to effectively deal with issues in the laboratory.

Ability to:

1. Follow all department policies and procedures to ensure product integrity and quality control.

- 2. Operate a computer and other office productivity machinery (e.g. calculator, copy machine, and computer printer).
- 3. Accurately record data in Microsoft Word, Excel, and Access.
- 4. Communicate effectively in verbal and written form.
- 5. Follow directions to successfully complete a variety of tasks and comply with health and safety standards.
- 6. Perform repetitive work in the laboratory to carry out job duties.
- 7. Work with minimal supervision when performing daily work duties.
- 8. Perform titration for analyses for pH buffers, media making, and quality control organisms.
- 9. Work efficiently, effectively, and cooperatively in a group, independently, and in a team-based environment.
- 10. Proactively maintain and document records in accordance with established procedures.
- 11. Write identification onto plates so that client and sample number can be tracked.
- 12. Properly practice safety and sterilization procedures to minimize the risk of any hazardous accidents.
- 13. Analyze situations accurately, take effective action, and work cooperatively with others.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained. Names of successful competitors are merged into the open eligible list established for use by the Department of Public Health in order of final scores regardless of testing date. Eligibility expires **24** months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

VETERAN'S PREFERENCE

Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows: 1) Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veterans' preference; 2) An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination; 3) Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.
