MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements as stated on this exam bulletin to be accepted into the examination. Part-time or full-time jobs, regardless of whether paid or volunteer positions, and inside or outside California state service will count toward experience.

All applicants must meet the minimum qualifications for this examination by the final filing date.

Research Writer

Either I: Three years of experience in feature writing of articles newspapers, magazines, trade journals, or for radio broadcast or in the writing of technical reports of digests of technical research studies. and

Education: Equivalent to graduation from college. (Additional qualifying experience may be substituted for the required education on a year-for-year basis.

Applicants qualifying under an education requirement MUST provide a copy of their college diploma and/or transcripts (unofficial are acceptable) by the final filing date as proof of completion of the required education. Competitors who fail to provide proof of completion of the required education will be eliminated from the examination.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Research Writer

Under direction, to do interpretive writing of technical material for news releases and publications of State agencies; and to do other related work.

EXAMINATION SCOPE

This examination consists of the following components:

Training and Experience Evaluation – Weighted 100% of the final score.

The examination will consists solely of a **Training and Experience Evaluation**. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received. Applicants will receive their score upon completion of the Training and Experience Evaluation process. Competitors who do not complete the Training and Experience Evaluation with be disqualified.

In addition to evaluating applicants' relative knowledge, skills, and ability, as demonstrated by quality and breadth of education and/or experience, emphasis in each exam component will be measuring competitively, relative job demands, each applicant's:

Knowledge of:

1) Knowledge of methods of presenting the results of research.

- 2) Knowledge of type, content, and form of articles required for publication by newspapers, magazines, and trade journals and the type of reading public normally served by these publications.
- 3) Knowledge of research procedures in social and economic problems.

Skill in:

- 4) Skills interpretive writing.
- 5) Skills in digesting, abstracting, and condensing technical reports and studies.

Ability to:

- 6) Ability to interpret statistical charts, graphs, and tables.
- 7) Ability to write articles which are adapted to the needs and interests of diverse groups.
- 8) Ability to write proper English.
- 9) Ability to prepare news releases, radio scripts, addresses, and talks by public officials.
- 10) Ability to write articles for publication.

Additional Desirable Qualifications

Originality and tact.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A servicewide, open eligible list for the Research Writer classification will be established for the State of California (all State of California departments, statewide).

The names of successful competitors will be merged onto the eligible list in order of final score regardless of exam date. Eligibility expires **twelve (12) months** after it is established. Applicants must then retake the examination to reestablish eligibility.

Assembly Bill 372, signed into law by Governor Brown on August 12, 2013, changes the way the Veterans Preference process is administered by the State of California. Veterans Preference will be awarded as follows, starting on January 1, 2014:

Veterans' Preference will be granted for this examination. In accordance with Government Codes 18973.1 and 18973.5, whenever any veteran, or widow or widower of a veteran, or a spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, he or she shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligible list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for Veteran's Preference. 2) An entrance exam is defined, under law, as any open competitive examination 3) Veterans Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status. Veterans status is verified by the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR). Information on this program and <u>the Veterans' Preference Application</u> (Std. form 1093) is available online. Additional information on veteran benefits is available at the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Your performance in the examination described in this bulletin will be rated against a predetermined job-related rating, and all applicants who pass will be ranked according to their score.

The California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service, if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all applicants will be notified.

General Qualifications: Applicants must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgement, the ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on the bulletin. In the case of continuous testing examinations, names are merged into the appropriate lists in order of final test scores (except as modified by veterans preference credits) regardless of the date of the test, and the resulting eligible lists will be used only to fill vacancies in the area shown on the bulletin

High School Equivalence: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Education Development (GED) Test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work; 3) certification form the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the competitor is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis.
