WHO CAN APPLY

Persons who meet the minimum qualifications as stated on this announcement may take this competitive examination.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Either One

Two years of experience in performing the duties of a Senior Health Physicist in California state service.

Or Two

Six or more years of increasingly responsible professional experience in health physics or a closely related field, at least three years of which must have included supervisory responsibility for a major program in health physics or radiologic health.

AND

Graduation from college with a major in radiologic health, radiologic science, health physics, engineering, mathematics, physical science, life science or a closely related field. (Possession of a Master's Degree in Radiologic Health, Radiologic Science, Health Physics, Engineering, Mathematics, Physical Science, or Life Science may be substituted for two years of the required general experience.)

The required degree must have been obtained from a recognized U.S. university or from a foreign university approved by the Bureau of Private Postsecondary and Vocational Education under the provision of California Education Code Chapter 3, Part 59, Division 10.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS

All candidates for, appointees to, and employees in the state civil service shall possess the general qualifications of integrity, honesty, sobriety, dependability, industry, thoroughness, accuracy, good judgment, initiative, resourcefulness, courtesy, ability to work cooperatively with others, willingness and ability to assume the responsibilities and to conform to the conditions of work characteristic of the employment, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

TYPICAL TASKS

This is the second supervisory level. Incumbents, under general direction, plan, organize, direct and evaluate a number of statewide radiation regulatory programs involving the surveillance and licensing of radiation sources and the evaluation, regulation, and control of industrial (limited to licensing only), research, medical, diagnostic, and therapeutic uses of radiation; coordinate, integrate, and evaluate programs and activities relating to licensing and inspections and insure compliance with State regulations; evaluate and resolve unusually complex technical and administrative problems in connection with license issuance, amendment, suspension, revocation, or denial; approve inclusion of specialized conditions and other unusual provisions in licenses; plan and direct a continuing program of staff training and development; propose new rules and regulations; coordinate the programs with related activities of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the State Division of Occupational Safety and Health, Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Health and Welfare, local health agencies, and other interested and affected agencies; keep abreast of technical development in radiation use and radiation protection; plan and direct special studies and investigations; address interested groups; prepare articles for publication; and do other related work.

Positions in this class are supervisory. Incumbents perform duties which are substantially different from those of subordinates and have the authority, in the interest of management, to: hire, transfer, suspend, layoff, recall, promote, discharge, assign, reward or discipline other employees, or responsibly direct them, or adjust their grievances, or effectively recommend such actions. The intent is to exclude lead persons.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION

The examination will consist of a Qualifications Assessment and is the sole component of the Supervising Health Physicist examination. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received. The Qualifications Assessment is designed to elicit specific information regarding each candidate's education, training, and experience relative to the testing classification. Responses to the questionnaire will be assessed based on pre-determined rating criteria. The Qualifications Assessment package will be emailed to the applicant in the form of a survey. Please monitor your email account's SPAM. Junk. Bulk. etc. Folder (s) as the examination email may be filtered depending on your specific account settings.

The participating department's reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meets the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination has changed. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION

It is your responsibility to make sure you meet the education and/or experience requirements stated on this announcement on the date you submit your application. Your signature on your application indicates that you have <u>read</u>, <u>understood</u>, and <u>possess</u> the basic qualifications required.

NOTE: Applications **must** include "to" and "from" dates (month/day/year), time base, job titles and/or civil service class title(s), and range (if applicable) for all work experience. College course Information **must** include title, number of semester or quarter units, name of institution, completion dates, and degree. Applications received without this information will be rejected. Applicants **must** submit a copy of either official or unofficial transcripts along with the application when using education to meet the entrance requirements for this examination.

SCOPE OF EXAMINATION: Rankings will be determined based on the depth and breadth of professional education and experience beyond what is minimally required. Emphasis will be placed on measuring:

Knowledge of:

- 1. Various parameters involving the use of radiation machines and radioactive materials.
- 2. California radiation control laws and regulations.
- 3. Supervisory methods and techniques.
- 4. Theory and practice of health physics and radiation protection.
- 5. Various parameters entering into evaluation of radiological hazards involved in medical, dental, industrial, and laboratory work.
- 6. Principles of leadership.
- 7. Basic research techniques.
- 8. Theory and practical design of shielding for protection against radiation.
- 9. Biological effects of ionizing radiation.
- 10. Radiation standards set by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement.
- 11. Functions and operations of State and Federal programs in radiation control and radiological health.
- 12. Principles of public administration and personnel management.

- 13. Radiation Dosimeter and the theory and design of instruments and method used to measure radiation.
- 14. State and departmental Equal Employment Opportunity policies.
- 15. Theory and principles of physical science and engineering.
- 16. Department's Equal Employment Opportunity objectives.
- 17. Manager's role in Equal Employment Opportunity and the processes available to meetEEO objectives.
- 18. Training procedures.
- 19. Advance scientific research techniques.
- 20. Trends and developments in radiological health.
- 21. Atomic and nuclear physics and nuclear chemistry and the use of radioisotopes.
- 22. Radiological ecology.
- 23. Radioactive waste disposal techniques and procedures.

Ability to:

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained. Names of successful competitors are merged into the open eligible list established for use by the Department of Public Health in order of final scores regardless of testing date. Eligibility expires **24** months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

VETERAN'S PREFERENCE

Pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, Veteran's Preference will be awarded in this examination as follows: 1) Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veterans' preference; 2) An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination; 3) Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.
